Police shut down illegal Algarve party

An illegal party being held in Silves and attended by around 80 people was shut down by police on 3 October due to breach of Covid-19 related rules.

The party was taking place near the Funcho dam, in the locality of São Bartolomeu de Messines, when the GNR received a "complaint to report noise from an isolated area in the vicinity", the Faro Territorial Command of the security force said.

'The GNR came to locate the source of the noise and soon realised that they were being faced with an illegal party with about 80 people, who were approached, inspected and given the indication to leave the site for failure to comply with the measures associated with the Covid-19 pandemic," said the same source.

GNR also announced that they detained two men and one woman, between 21 and 32 years old, for drug trafficking, and raised six administrative offenses for the consumption of narcotics.

Also seized at the site were "a total of 179 doses of hashish, 13 doses of cocaine and 7 doses of cannabis", while the party organisers "were identified and the facts forwarded to the Silves

The contingency situation, which has been in force in mainland Portugal since the 15 of September and will remain at least until the 14 of October, prevents gatherings of more than 10 people.

Hearing on migration policy

The Portuguese Parliament will hear the Minister of the Interior and the Minister of State and Presidency for clarification on the country's migration policy and reception conditions.

The requests for a hearing in the Committee on Constitutional Affairs, Rights, Freedoms and Guarantees, two from the Left Block and one from the PSD party, were unanimously approved.

On the 29 of September, the BE announced that it wanted to hear, 'as a matter of urgency", Ministers Eduardo Cabrita and Mariana Vieira da Silva on the situation of refugees arriving in Portugal.

In their request for a hearing with the minister of the interior, the politicians expressed concern about the lack of vacancies in the Temporary Installation Centres (CIT), which oblige the holding of refugees arriving in the country in prison and military

establishments.
In the request for the presence in parliament of the Minister of State and Presidency, Mariana Vieira da Silva, the BE said that Portugal had committed itself to "receive 1,100 refugees from Turkey and Egypt," but only "186 people arrived from Turkey and 220 people from Egypt," adding that of the 1,000 people from Greece that the country had offered to receive, "no one has arrived yet.

In its application, the PSD party wants Eduardo Cabrita to clarify what measures the government is taking to prevent further landings of migrants on the Algarve coast and what kind of re-housing is planned for those already on national territory in order to avoid "sporadic escapes such as those that have occurred".

On 15 February, Portuguese Foreign Minister Augusto Santos Silva confirmed that Portugal had expressed its willingness to receive up to 100 migrants from the Moria camp on the Greek island of Lesbos after the fire that destroyed the camp's infrastructure.

On 11 September, the Secretary of State for Integration and Migration said that Portugal was prepared to receive 28 minors from the island of Lesbos and other Greek localities later this month. which would be divided across different cities.

In parallel, under a bilateral agreement between Portugal and Greece, the Portuguese authorities undertook to speed up the already planned transfer of the first 100 people.

In total, the agreement provides for the reception of up to 1 000 people in refugee camps in Greece and has been given the "green light" by the European Commission, with the situation being monitored by the International Organisation for Migration.

WEATHER

A warm and mild weekend

Warm weather will continue in Portugal with no chance of rain and predominantly clear skies across the country.

Lisbon: It is to continue to feel warm in the capital with temperatures peaking at 27 degrees over the weekend and only dropping to lows of 16 degrees. Blue skies are expected for the remainder of the week although it will be feeling cooler with average highs of 24 degrees and lows of 12 degrees.

The north: Some hazy high clouds are expected on Sunday in the north although temperatures will remain warm with average highs of 22 degrees and lows of 12 degrees. From Tuesday the cloud cover is to increase and temperatures are to fall slightly to highs of 19 degrees and lows of 9 degrees.

The centre: Saturday will see temperatures peaking at 26 degrees in the centre before falling to highs of 21 degrees on Sunday and for the rest of the week. Clear skies are expected all week and there will be no chance of rain. Northerly winds will make it feel cooler each

The south: It is set to be a warm weekend in the south with temperatures peaking at 27 degrees and dropping to nightly lows of 19 degrees. There is a chance of some cloud cover on Monday but this is to clear as the week progresses and temperatures are to remain steady with highs of 25 degrees.

Government "searching" for unregistered Portuguese in UK

The Portuguese Government has admitted to "searching" for Portuguese residents in the United Kingdom who have not yet registered as residents, since they only have until 31 June to do so.

he proximity of the end of the transition period to 'Brexit' and the lack of progress in the negotiation between London and Brussels constitutes "an alert for the Government" namely for a renewed "attention to citizens", said Ana Paula Zacarias, the Secretary of State for European Affairs.

"We can see how many citizens have not signed up yet, how many should have done it and haven't done it, why didn't they do it? We must now be more objective and go in search of more of those citizens who are outside the normal system", she added. Ana Paula Zacarias replied to Deputy Carlos Gonçalves (PSD), who expressed concern about "a fringe of Portuguese", corresponding to "almost 100,000", who have not yet registered and the lack of response from the Portuguese consulate regarding the need for Portuguese documents to

be "up to date".

Both Carlos Gonçalves and Isabel Oneto (PS) questioned the Secretary of State about the revision of the contingency plan for the United Kingdom's departure from the European Union, which Ana Paula Zacarias announced on 16 September. The official replied that this is an "update of the plan", "now revised in view of the current situation", and highlighted the need in particular for companies to prepare, with or without agreement, in the area of customs rights.

"Companies that export fresh products to the UK need to prepare, because it is plausible that there could be disruptions here or there in the market and in transportation", she warned, stressing that, with or without an agreement, "there must always be an adaptation [...] from Portuguese exporting companies to the United Kingdom".

Portugal with 11 of the most sustainable destinations in the world

Portugal has 11 of the world's top 100 sustainable destinations. Organised for the past six years by Green Destinations and partners, with the aim to showcase sustainability, good practices of emerging and established destinations, Portugal has been awarded with the highest number of destinations alongside the Netherlands. Destinations across Portugal were singled out for their good practices, with Lagos being chosen as the Algarve's most sustainable destination.

Ronaldo could face US judge

A federal judge in Nevada has ruled that she will hear legal arguments to determine if Kathryn Mayorga, the American woman who in 2018 accused international soccer star Cristiano Ronaldo of raping her in a Las Vegas hotel suite in 2009, was mentally fit to enter into nondisclosure agreement with Ronaldo's lawyers in 2010 that paid her \$375,000 in exchange for her silence. While a court date has not yet been set, it is possible Ronaldo would have to appear in person to the proceedings.

Teachers union calls for full disclosure on Covid cases

The national teachers union has called on the government to fully disclose the number of positive Covid-19 cases recorded at schools across the country. Fenprof has accused the government of acting outside the law in not revealing a map of infections at schools. It added that schools were being treated differently and that positive cases are not leading to the same precautionary measures being taken as they have been in other situations.

Port wine sales drop 40% due to lack of tourists

A lack of tourists to Portugal saw port wine sales drop by over 40 percent. The national market has been the most affected in terms of sales of Port wine, having fallen 40.26% between January and August. The data are from the Douro and Porto Wine Institute (IVDP) and reveal the effects of the lack of tourists in the country. Since 2017, with the boom in the tourism sector, Portugal had become the main market for Port wine, in terms of value, but this year, France once again took top spot on the podium.

Nursing homes: an unsolved problem



Even with a negative test, residents in nursing homes have to stay 14 days in quarantine when they return. It is one of the measures from the DGS to guarantee that the spread of the virus is contained. However, it can be harmful to physical and psychological well-being and maybe unnecessary before negative test.



Measures to prevent the contagion of Covid-19 have limited activities that require social interaction, especially with people from outside the nursing home, and have restricted visits from families.

he elderly population was one of the most affected groups with the Covid-19 situation, not only because they are at risk group but also because they are becoming more and more isolated.

The Portugal News

investigated the reality of nursing home residents and the impact of the General Health Direction (DGS) guidelines in three different institutions in the Algarve.

Maria de São José Louro, technical director of the Casa de Repouso e Saúde of São Brás de Alportel, quarantees that they are trying to minimise all risks; however, she is the first to admit the psychological problems that this causes. One of the DGS's regulations is prophylactic isolation - common to all the nursing homes - when residents move to outside the nursing home to, for example, visit a doctor or go to a hospital, they have to stay and isolate for 14 days upon return. "If they stay at the hospital for

"If they stay at the hospital for less than 24 hours, they are required, according to DGS guidelines, to complete 14 days of prophylactic isolation. If they are hospitalised for more than 24 hours, they must be subjected to a Covid-19 test, but even with a negative result they must be quarantined for 14 days. 14 days in a room can have a severe effect on the physical and psychological situation", she said. The same process happens when they are

This nursing home is specialised in receiving patients with Alzheimer's disease. "We have 59 residents, of which 21 have Alzheimer", said the director.

She explains that people with Alzheimer are always moving, "imagine someone moving towards the door for many hours, the cognitive part is compromised and is alarmed". With the isolation, "they change sleep schedules, they sleep in the afternoon", and she adds that it is "very difficult to give them an active routine, so for many reasons the impact that these 14 days have on people in isolation is a huge loss of capacity"

Measures to prevent the contagion of Covid-19 have limited activities that require social interaction, especially with people from outside the nursing home, and have restricted visits from families. "Visits are made abroad using an acrylic barrier", explained the director.

Video calls aren't always a good solution. "Video calling for these people has a negative result; they have a very high level of dissatisfaction, especially for the family", she said, and justifies that people with Alzheimer cannot pay attention and interact with the conversation on the screen. At the Monte Da Palhagueira -Country House Nursing & Retirement Homes in the Algarve, 100% of the residents are foreign and a lot of them are used to communicating with their families by video calls because of the distance. Residents who have family living in Portugal and who are used to family contact were more surprised. "The human touch is essential", explained Alexandre Neves, the General Manager of Monte da Pagalheira.

Monte da Pagalheira is a village with an associated nursing home, in order to create a family atmosphere, in both. "In the village people have almost total independence, we help as much as necessary, but with independence. We have nurses 24 hours a day, 7 days a week", he said. This concept allows, for example, couples to live close to each other, one can be in the

village and another in the nursing home "if one needs more support and the other is still in a very independent state", he explains.

In his opinion, the pandemic situation highlighted Portugal even more as a safe destination to enjoy retirement age and confesses that the waiting list for Monte da Pagalheira keeps growing as demand increases. Also, village residents, because they have their own house's, still make their living independent and keep in touch with the outside, they only saw the number of social activities decrease, in order to comply with the DGS guidelines.
In Lagoa, João Carlos Pereira, the president of Centro Popular de Lagoa, also has other concerns. Due to the alarmism of the media "those who are autonomous and were on the waiting list, end up giving up because they don't want to feel like they are in prison", he said. However, he ensured that nursing homes "are not a dark place, as it seems now in the media". The space is open, users can move around as much as possible and the nursing home always tries to promote some activities, always according to the safety measures. But, of course, "we have to comply with the rules in order to guarantee safety", he

To finish, Maria de São José
Louro made an appeal: "Social
security and DGS should talk to
those on the ground: visits
through the window without
social contact are nothing, and
the elderly were used to a lot of
affection, this is all very cold" she
said while adding that "another
six months like this and i don't
know how the residents will be
able to cope".

All the three nursing homes confirmed that they don't have any registered positive cases of coronavirus.

Portugal tourism campaign with discounts up to 50% on hundreds of experiences

Gastronomy, accommodation, museums, travel and tours throughout the country are being discounted in Portugal to encourage domestic tourism while inviting the Portuguese to "visit a lot for a little".

#TuPodes - Visit a lot for a little" is the new internal campaign of Portugal tourism board and it follows the motto of the promotion launched at the beginning of the Summer, which invited national tourists to rediscover "the best destination in the world". But now there are

budget of €50 million to support

visits to museums and train trips will be available at affordable prices, which may include discounts of up to 50%"

"We want discounts always over 30%. Therefore, it is one of the conditions for the consumer to

have the perception that it is a privilege granted through this programme, and Tourism of Portugal will reimburse 50% of the price", said Rita Marques, the Secretary of State for Tourism to Lusa News Agency.

Covid-19 related travel complaints boom

Analysis carried out by Portal da Queixa has confirmed that the constraints resulting from the Covid-19 pandemic were reflected in a rise in consumer complaints addressed to the Tourism sector.

Between June and September - the main reason for complaints was the request for reimbursement (1,167 complaints), an increase of 342% over the same period in 2019, where only 264 complaints were registered for the same reason.

Between 1 June and 28 September, 2020, a total of 2,457 complaints were registered in the Portal of the Complaint in the Hotels, Travel and Tourism category. The analysis carried out on the subcategories revealed that 1,189 complaints are directed to Travel Booking Agencies and Sites, 888 complaints (36%) are related to airlines and 380 complaints are related to stays. Compared to the same period last year, there has been a 64% increase in the number of complaints

With regard to airlines, the main reasons for complaints are requests for reimbursement and delays. Among the three companies with the highest volume of complaints are TAP (318), Ryanair (278) and Easyjet (111).

"When analyzing the Tourism sector, it was clear that there had been an impact of the pandemic on its normal functioning. Most complaints are related to constraints, a consequence of Covid-19. Most complaints refer to requests for reimbursement, either because the consumer requested the cancellation of the flight / reservation, or because the hotel / airline was forced to cancel the service", explains the analysis team at Portal da Queixa.

Over 1 million downloads of Covid app

Since the launch of the app one month ago, the 'StayAway Covid' screening application has been installed on 1.26 million smartphones and more than 100 patients have used the tool to alert others to risk of contact.



he data about the app was released by the president of the Ministry of Health's Shared Services (SPMS), who during the usual press conference on the Covid-19 pandemic in Portugal, took stock of the first month of the application, launched on 1 September.

According to Luís Goes Pinheiro, among the more than one million users, 107 codes relating to positive tests have already been inserted in the application. These codes are assigned by the doctor on the 'Trace Covid' platform whenever a user tests positive for the new coronavirus and can be introduced in the screening application to alert all recent risk contacts that also use the 'StayAway Covid' tool.

"We know that this is an application based on the principle of freedom. The freedom to install, the freedom to use it and the freedom to enter the code when the doctor provides it", explained the head of shared services to justify the small number of codes In this regard, the President of SPMS took the opportunity to call on people to actually use the application and in particular, users that test

positive, recalling that data protection is not a problem. "If they do, those people who have been high-risk contacts in recent days will not know who the person who entered the code was. Their anonymity will always be guaranteed," he assured.

The 'StayAway Covid' app, which allows Covid-19 contagion networks to be traced, has also been the source of some of the contacts for the National Health line since the first week it was launched. Since 1 September, SNS 24 has already received 106 calls from people notified by the application.

Infections have increased but are less severe

Prime Minister António Costa has said that there had been significant developments in the Covid-19 pandemic since mid-August, but stressed that the infections were now "less serious".

"Since mid-August we have been experiencing a constant rise in infections, in line with most European countries," the Prime Minister said, adding that "these are infections that today, fortunately, are less serious than at the start of the crisis." António Costa, who spoke in statements to RTP and TVI at the entrance to Pedro Abrunhosa's concert in São Domingos de Benfica, Lisbon, stressed, however, that the minor seriousness of the infections "does not allow

anyone to reduce the level of care provided".

The head of the government also said that, despite the "significant" evolution of the pandemic, the "pressure" on the National Health Service "has remained stable".

PS party present measures to vote in times of pandemic

The PS party is looking to provide solutions to problems relating to voting during a time of pandemic in the country.

The socialist party (PS) wants to increase the number of early voting places available, from one per district to at least one per council, and to also allow measures to be put in place to allow those confined due to Covid-19 restrictions to have a chance to cast their vote in the presidential elections due to take place in the first month of 2021.

One of the PS initiatives intends to change the rules of early voting in all amendments and referendums.

In another initiative, the PS intends to create an exceptional regime of early voting in the election of the President of the Republic for voters who it has been decreed obligatory to quarantine due to Covid-19 disease.

"In this context of a pandemic, there seems to be a perceived risk relating to voting, which may be characterised by a low participation, especially by citizens included in older age groups or at risk groups", justified the socialists, when presenting the reasons to create the diploma.

Madeira roads considered "exemplary"

Madeira's roads are exemplary in terms of planning, financing, construction, modernisation and maintenance, the regional secretary for Infrastructure and Equipment, Pedro Fino, said while stressing that they allow "safe and rational" traffic.

The rugged terrain of the island of Madeira has always been a major obstacle to population mobility, but over the last two decades there has been an extraordinary effort to build new road infrastructures. which has led to a radical change in terms of accessibility," Fino said. He spoke at the reception of 30 members of the Slovenian Road Association of North-East Slovenia in Funchal, in which he highlighted the "great challenges" imposed by the "natural

characteristics" of the network of roads, tunnels and bridges. "Madeira is undoubtedly an example of planning, financing, building, modernising and maintaining roads that allow safe and rational traffic," he said. The Road Association of North-East Slovenia was established in 1985 in the city of Maribor, Slovenia, and brings together elements from various business areas, including construction and transport professionals and amateurs

The purpose of the visit to Madeira is to share knowledge, considering the autonomous region is an "example" of road investment. Pedro Fino stressed that next year the Presidency of the Council of the European Union will be divided between two countries -Portugal in the first semester and Slovenia in the second semester - and that it is therefore important to show this country "the excellent use of structural funds in the region, which have enabled the development and

improvement of the quality of life of the populations". Since its foundation, the Road Association of North-East Slovenia has organised educational and professional excursions to showcase road transport projects and solutions in various parts of Europe. "The idea behind these initiatives is to establish useful contacts and exchange professional experiences with foreign experts in road construction and transport, thus broadening their professional horizons," explained Pedro Fino.

Lagos municipal kennel expansion

Lagos Council has announced plans to rehabilitate and expand the Municipal Animal Collection Centre.

Licensed since the 1 February 2012, the socalled "Kennel / Gatil Municipal" currently can accommodate 42 dogs and 7 cats.

The rehabilitation and expansion project, recently awarded and currently under preparation, aims to create 16 more kennels for dogs, allowing the release of some existing kennels for the cattery operation. In practice, the aim is to increase the capacity of the facility for the temporary reception of animals and to improve the general conditions of the space.

Alongside this investment, the municipality remains committed to promoting adoption on a larger scale with an increase in information available and awareness in the population. To this end,

the partnership with local animal protection associations has been decisive, which have led to the development of voluntary work, namely in terms of information and awareness, of campaigns to collect food and hygiene products, health care and promote responsible adoption.

Meanwhile, the municipal contract has recently been completed to provide the Lagos Animal Cemetery with a further 36 burial units. Of these new units, four are for large animals, 25 are for medium-sized animals and 7 are for small animals.

The works, representing an investment of €17,350.00, will almost double the capacity of the facility which was inaugurated in 2017.

Algarve hotels register 40% drop

In September, the Algarve registered a hotel occupancy rate of 52.5 percent, 40 percent lower than the same period of 2019, mainly due to the decline in the British market.

According to the Association of Hotels and Tourist Enterprises of the Algarve (AHETA): "The British market was the one that most contributed to the decrease (68.2 percent), followed by the Irish and the German".

The figures came from the monthly summary of the activity of the sector, one of the most affected by Covid-19 pandemic, according to Lusa News

The quarantine imposed by the United Kingdom on those who travel to Portugal was restored on 12 September, after a period of opening an air corridor between United Kingdom and Portugal. The need to quarantine for 14 days upon arrival in the UK from Portugal is said to have been a major factor in the decrease in holiday makers from the country.

House prices in Portugal rose 1 percent in the third quarter of 2020 compared to the previous quarter, now standing at €2,090 per square metre (m²).

ccording to data provided by Idealista, the regions that saw a price increase in quarterly terms were the Centre (4.4 percent), Autonomous Region of Madeira (2.5 percent), Algarve (2.1 percent) and the North (1.3 percent). Conversely prices fell in the Autonomous Region of the Azores (-4.5 percent), in the Metropolitan Area of Lisbon (-1.4 percent) and Alentejo (-0.2 percent). The Metropolitan Area of Lisbon, with €2,954 per m². remains the most expensive region, followed by the Algarve (€2,343 per m²), the North (€1,787 per

m²) and the Autonomous Region of Madeira (€1,595 per m2). At the other end of the scale, there are the Autonomous Region of the Azores (€997 per m²), the Alentejo (€1,029 per m²) and the Centre (€1,083 per m²) as the cheapest regions. The ranking of the most expensive districts continues to be led by Lisbon (€3,268 per m²), followed by Faro (€2,343

Banco de Portugal improves unemployment rate forecast

The Bank of Portugal forecasts an unemployment rate of 7.5 percent in 2020, a downward revision from the 10.1 percent projected in the June Economic Bulletin.

The Economic Bulletin points out that, due to the contraction in activity stemming from the Covid-19 pandemic, there will be an increase in the unemployment rate to 7.5 percent in annual average terms, from 6.5 percent in 2019, a figure that represents a downward revision from that released in June.

"The specificity of the pandemic crisis has led to a fall in the unemployment rate in the first half of 2020, against a background of a significant reduction in the working population. With the gradual normalisation of circumstances associated with the pandemic, an increase in the unemployment rate and the labour force is projected in the second half of the year", reads the central bank document.

Safe-tree-net



Wouldn't it be great if you could put all the trees in a town into a sort of app where you can see what kind they are, where they are, and if they are in danger you would get a notification to let you know - so you can come to the rescue?

This petition is due to the unpopular decision to remove some trees without warning in Faro town recently.

his is exactly what the national political group PAN (People, Animals, Nature) is attempting to achieve. To that end, on 30 September, they recommended to the Municipal Assembly of Faro that they join the Earth Protective Communities (EPC) network, and create a georeferenced register of their trees. This means they would go and identify, one by one, all the trees or shrubs in the parks, streets and squares around Faro. They would then upload their details onto an electronic database, that's updated regularly by the forest workers in charge of them, and the information would be made available to all citizens.

This petition is due to the unpopular decision to remove some trees without warning in Faro town recently. It's caused quite a stir, and as Paulo Baptista, the municipal deputy of PAN explains: "We must not think it's natural that the removal of trees is carried out without the citizens having a say, since trees are everyone's heritage. Situations such as the removal of the orange trees from Largo da Sé, or the felling of trees in Praceta Dr. Clementino de Brito Pinto, of which only about ten specimens

are left, should not happen again.' If this proposal is accepted it will mean that every tree will essentially be given its own Facebook page. The tree will have its own profile and be able to let people know where it is, what it is, who looks after it, how healthy it is, and most importantly, if it gets itself into any trouble - it can send out notifications that will alert the public within 10 days of anything being done to it PAN hopes this measure

will put an end to the radical pruning of trees. But it's not just the trees that get into trouble. Many different creatures live in all kinds of tree houses, and PAN wants to make it so that nobody except professionals are allowed to remove bird nests, or their eggs. Finally, the removal of trees should only be

carried out in an

emergency where they represent a risk to people or property. If this proposal is accepted then Faro will become the latest member of the Earth Protective Communities network which describes itself as a "global grassroots movement in which towns/cities, educational institutions, businesses and other organisations work together to protect the land, wildlife, air, soil and water." They plan to make all the towns in their network carbon neutral, to protect and improve their local ecosystems, and reduce their use of single- use plastic. As Paulo Baptista concluded, "These proposals are all just common sense. 'Their application will transform the municipality and bring it closer to the best environmental practices".





Germany at thirty



I have just spent two weeks driving around Germany interviewing people (mostly climate scientists, since you ask), and I have come to the conclusion that it is the best-run – and quite possibly just the best – major country in the world right now.



Germany today is the fairest, the least conflicted, the most peaceful and actually the nicest major country on the planet.

ome small countries are absolute jewels, of course, but it's easier if you're small. Big powers fight more wars, contain more divisions, suffer nastier and more ridiculous delusions of grandeur. But if you only consider countries with more than 50 million people, then Germany today is the fairest, the least conflicted, the most peaceful, actually the nicest major country on the planet

That wasn't true thirty years ago, and it may not be true thirty years hence, but it's worth noting because this

month marks the thirtieth anniversary of the unification of Germany in 1990, just one year after the Berlin Wall came down. Compared to what happened after the first time it was unified, it has all worked out rather well. The first unification of Germany, in 1871, was achieved by war, and led to more and much bigger wars - not entirely Germany's fault, of course, but certainly the consequence of the sudden appearance of a highly nationalistic new great power in the heart of Europe

After the Second World

War, Germany was divided into three. The eastern third was emptied of Germans and given to Poland (in compensation for the eastern third of prewar Poland, which was kept by the Soviet Union). The middle part, also under Soviet occupation, became Communist-ruled 'East Germany', while the rest, with most of the population, became 'West Germany'.

The 'two Germanies' became the cockpit of the Cold War, with huge armies of tanks ready to roll and nuclear weapons not far behind them. Many people understood that this

could not go on forever, that some day the country would have to be reunited but they were terrified by the prospect. They feared that the process of reunification might trigger a war, and they also feared a reunited Germany. Lord Ismay, the British general who became the first secretary-general of the NATO alliance (which included West Germany), put it bluntly: "NATO exists to keep the Russians out, the Americans in, and the Germans down "French iournalist and poet François Mauriac said it more elegantly: "I love Germany so much that I'm

glad there are two of them." If the trigger to end the East German Communist regime had been in British, French and American hands, it might never have been pulled. But it was actually in the hands of the East Germans themselves, and in 1989 they brought down their oppressors without a shot being fired. All the other Communist states of Eastern Europe followed suit. There was great joy in both

parts of Germany - the street party after the Berlin Wall came down was probably the best and certainly the longest I have ever attended - but there was considerable trepidation elsewhere. However Mikhail Gorbachev, the reformist Soviet leader, reassured everybody by declaring that Moscow had no objection to German reunification, and the deed was done thirty years ago. It has worked out very well. There are sad people and even wicked people in Germany, like everywhere else, but as a society it radiates contentment. Unflustered competence

lubricated by a general tone of good-will make minor daily transactions less of an ordeal, and the strident nationalism that now disfigures so many other countries is conspicuous by its absence. In the place of that the Germans have a dedication to the Europe

Germans have a dedication to the European project: like 'Amens' in a church, invocations of 'Europe' punctuate political conversations. And if you say this is a defensive reaction against Germany's terrible history in the two generations before 1945, I would probably agree - but what's wrong with that?

contrast between the formerly Communist-ruled east and the rest of the country, to the great disadvantage of the former, is gradually eroding: average incomes among 'Ossis'(easterners) are now up to almost 90% of 'Wessi' earnings. All the 'coolest' cities, the magnets that attract the young, are in the former east: Berlin, Dresden, and now Leipzig.

It's not paradise, but when you compare it with the incompetent, belligerent populism that prevails in formally democratic countries like the United States, the United Kingdom, Brazil and India, it looks pretty good. 'Wir schaffen das" (We can manage this), said Chancellor Angela Merkel when over a million, mostly Muslim, refugees arrived in Germany in 2016, and four years later it looks like she was right.

'Mutti' (Mummy), as Germans call her, has been chancellor for half of the past thirty years, so there will be a collective holding of breath when she retires next year. But the world would be a better and safer place if there were more countries like Germany.

Plus there's no speed limit at all on the autobahns. Where else can you drive at 160 kph and have cars whooshing past you all the time?

The Algarve Network for Families in Need response to the pandemic

The group has existed for a number of years but when the pandemic hit and more specifically the lockdown, a rapid response was needed as tens of thousands of people were in a situation where they had no money and no food.

For example, many seasonal workers had suddenly realised that the work they thought they would be returning to after the winter had disappeared. These people work for a minimum wage and have no reserves to cover any period of unemployment. They run up debts in the winter and work unforgiving hours in the summer to pay off their debts. Equally affected were the selfemployed who depend on tourism for their livelihoods. Again, many of these have no work in the winter. At the time we had no idea that the problem was going to be so widespread. But clearly the Network needed to change to

meet the demand. For this reason, we launched our food

appeal, collecting food at a variety

of points across the Algarve and

accepting donations as offered.

We would then distribute to

families who were without an

income. At the most difficult time (April, May, June) we were sending out food for approximately 1500 people per week, fortunately this currently stands at 400 as some people have managed to find some work through the summer whilst others have begun to receive state aid. Our biggest fear is that the demand will increase greatly through the coming six months as tourism is again decreasing and with it the work available. To date we have helped about 5500 people including adults and children. These have ranged from those who have needed a one-off supply of food to see them through a few weeks while they sorted out alternative supplies to those who have required a weekly/fortnightly supply throughout this very difficult period.

. We have distributed food from Aljezur to Faro. We have six hubs from which we distribute, each with a lead person with their own volunteers. As well as the food hubs we temporarily had a nonfood centre based at Odiaxere Football club where anyone in need could visit to get clothes, bedding, baby equipment and so much more, all donated and totally free to whomever needed them.

There are some moments I can't forget - grown adults crying in front of me because I am giving them food, the heartfelt despair of others not knowing how they are going to feed their families, the messages of gratitude received from families which we have helped and which are totally undeserved as we are only doing what humanity dictates. It's hard to make any sort of sense out of the current situation. I have never known anything like it in my life

In addition, East Algarve Families in Need (Pink Flamingo Croquet



and Social Club) a separate but parallel group were giving food from VRSA to Tavira / São Brás de Alportel. Whilst this service was suspended for a couple of months through the summer, it will recommence shortly. All the food given out has been attained through donations.

Grass roots football is 'Alive and Kicking' for all ages in the Algarve



East Algarve Football Club (EAFC) is keeping the spirit of adult local football alive in this perfect part of Portugal and can accommodate mixed age group sessions to preserve the future of 'our beautiful game' at all levels here in the East Algarve. EAFC started as a side branch of East Algarve Walking Football (EAWF), a club formed over 5 years ago which holds walking football sessions and enters tournaments for the over 50s. EAWF has many members of all nationalities and has achieved 13

competition victories out of 15 entered, playing against opposition coming to the Algarve from all over the world.

Since the recent introduction of normal (running) football sessions to the members of EAWF, EAFC have entered events for various age groups, including a prestigious 11-a-side game played at the stadium of Ferreiras FC against the Welsh National over 55s team. A well fought, equally balanced and exciting game resulting in a 5-4 win for the visitors. Both EAFC and EAWF are

heavily involved in community and charity work throughout the Eastern Algarve, notably during the recent Covid-19 difficulties where the club has provided community and family support for hundreds of families from Vila Real de Santo António to Faro. EAFC and EAWF have also dedicated a lot of time and effort, and raised money through events, donations and contributions, for many charities and good causes. The demand for both walking football and 'normal' football resulted in the clubs running four sessions per week prelockdown, spread over two venues in Olhão and Tavira. Vilamoura International School places students in reference universities around the world



The Vilamoura International School(CIV), a private educational institution for almost 36 years, continues to assert itself as a reference school. Every year students leave the CIV, the national and Cambridge curricula, for universities around the world.

This year, more than 30 finalists from Year 13, of Cambridge Assessment International Education and the 12th year of the National Curriculum went to universities of great prestige; Portuguese (Universidade do Algarve, Universidade de Lisboa. Universidade Nova de Lisboa, Universidade do Porto, Instituto Politécnico de Coimbra), and international (Georgia Tech Institute, University of Manchester, Queen Mary University of Manchester, City University of London, University of Edinburgh, Leiden University and King's College London).

"The solid formation of students has been over the years a constant and distinctive mark of the CIV students, the result of the hard work of students and pedagogical teams that accompany them", says the pedagogical direction of the Vilamoura International School.

After all, what do the results say about preparing students in the CIV?

This school of international education is at the top of the schools with the smallest discrepancy between internal and external evaluations. To $understand\,the\,issue,\,the$ Jornal de Notícias (27/06/20) presents two tables of discrepancies observed in public and private schools and consider that "schools where the internal and external grades are closer are in the top places". Placing the Vilamoura International School in the 4th place in the ranking of schools with the least discrepancy (a difference of 71 tenths in 36 examinations considered). This data is of great importance and translate the

rigor of schools in the monitoring of their students.

As far as international exams are concerned, the CIV has achieved better than the world average for a number of years, enabling its students to reach positions at the best universities in Europe, putting Vilamoura on the map of the most prestigious international schools in Portugal. It should be noted that the Cambridge Curriculum is globally recognized by higher education institutions and is valued in the labor market.

With regard to national rankings, in the 2019 results analysis, the CIV ranks 4th in the 2019 School Ranking according to Jornal de Notícias, climbing 33 positions in relation to the previous year. Among 629 schools with secondary school exams, that daily highlights this school of international education by the average score achieved in the exams of the eight main disciplines (CE): 14.79 values. In the results achieved in

2020, the CIV reached an average of 16 values in the 11th and 12th grade examinations. Of these, we highlight the averages of Mathematics A (17,7), Economics A (17,8), Philosophy (18,1) and History B (18).

The same applies to primary education. The news agency LUSA and the newspaper Público (27/06/20) attribute to the Vilamoura International School the place of best basic school of 2nd and 3rd Cycles of the Algarve, placing it in the 39th position of the National Ranking, among more than 1100 schools in the rankings of 2019. In the final exams of cycle, Portuguese and Mathematics of 9th year, the CIV reached an average of four values.

The school focuses its educational project on the development of cognitive and socio-affective skills, embodied by democratic and humanist values, following the dream of "preparing excellence for life".

Preventing rural fires



So far this year over half of rural fires were caused by people undertaking the burning of cut and piled waste or through extensive burning of uncut scrubs and allowing the fire to get out of control.

Simply following the safety steps in place prevents this, and would avoid thousands of deployments of the emergency services, and the risk to property and people. As the Critical Fire Period

As the Critical Fire Period finished on 30th September there will be more controlled burns. When the rural fire risk in your municipality is Low, Moderate or High, it is necessary to notify either the ICNF through its website https://www.icnf.pt/ or by contacting 808 200 520 or your local municipality (where the municipality is not connected into the system). You will then be registered and you will receive notification, with guidance on any safety measures that apply. If the rural

fire risk is very high or maximum an "authorization" is required using the same process.

Undertaking this process is important as the emergency services, be it Bombeiros, GNR or whoever are all aware that you are undertaking that burn.

Remember if using a contractor/local farmer it is your responsibility as a land owner to do this.

In undertaking a controlled burn it is essential to follow the safety instructions in particular: avoid burning in windy conditions; start early in the morning when the humidity is usually higher; ensure that it is monitored; keep you mobile phone with you, have a water supply close by; and make sure it is properly extinguished and notify the relevant authority afterwards

afterwards.

Going Green

We're in week five of the Portugal News' "Going Green" series...

As a responsible thriving renewables company, we are increasing efforts in awareness. Not just for our solutions, but our local and regional Algarvean environment.

We look inland to focus on water - this time discussing the Algarve barragems. December 2019 heavy rains did not end the Algarve's drought.

Precipitation would have needed to increase fourfold to achieve normal levels.

Odelouca Dam reservoir is the main source of water for the region, supported by other surface and underground sources. Its capacity of 134 million cubic metres was on-stream in 2009.

From the early 1960's many artesian wells and dams have been constructed stopping realities of "drought" that ancestors had to endure. This has helped condition the idea that the Algarve is "immune" to drought.

In April 2020 the dams of Funcho, Beliche, Odeleite and Odelouca were very low. This means we are drawing aquifer water.

Folk continue to turn on taps forgetting water is a scarce and finite resource. Farmers are the main consumers accounting for 60%. In comparison, golf courses use 6%. There is another reality - Algarve councils are losing water in numerous pipelines, figures show 16.6% to a huge 55.1%.

Talk of building new dams and researching the idea of cripplingly expensive desalination plants won't work. Mayors need to study the research. And act. The sixteen municipalities should form a working group. Firstly they must combat the growing faulty pipe network and over-irrigation. Then water management firms must step up and play their part.

Regional authority Aguas do Algarve invests €100 million in maintenance. It awarded a €41m contract to Acciona Água S.A. in charge of the maintenance of sanitation subsystems of wastewater at the Almargem and Faro-Noroeste ETAR wastewater treatment plants. The second, over €58 million, was given to Be Water S.A. and will see the company taking over the same responsibilities at the Lagos and Albufeira Ponte ETAR

We're all in this together. And we need to reduce consumption. There has been no rain in the central Algarve since May 15, 2020.

People only react to crisis - proof was Covid-19. Ever turned a tap on to find no water and heard banging?

Porsche has revised its powerful Panamera Turbo S, but what have the changes brought? Jack Evans finds out.



What is it?

The Panamera is Porsche's big, bruising performance executive car - and for some time now it's set the benchmark for driver involvement in this segment, outgunning rivals when it comes to outright excitement behind the wheel. Now, Porsche has seen fit to update it, tweaking the way it looks - ever so slightly - while adding a decent slug more power. We're testing it in full-fat Turbo S specification, which stands as the most powerful Panamera in the range. Buckle up to find out what it's like..

What's new?

From the outside at least, it doesn't appear that much has changed. It's still vast in proportion, with the front and rear separated by what feels like a postcode's-worth of wheelbase. The car's nose has been given a tweak in terms of design, mind you, but it's largely the same look as the Panamera we saw released back in 2019. It's underneath where things

have been given a considerable edit. The damping has been improved, for instance, while the front axle bearings and engine mountings have been revised to increase the level of dynamic response you get. Plus, it has taken the same steering control as the 911 to improve the car's input reactions.

What's under the bonnet? The Panamera Turbo S is powered by a thumping 4.0-litre twin-turbocharged V8 engine that makes 621bhp and 820Nm of torque. It represents gains of 79bhp and 50Nm over the old Turbo model, in fact. Power is sent to all four wheels through an eight-speed automatic gearbox and, when given enough space, means that the Panamera Turbo S will hit a top speed of 196mph, while the sprint to 60mph takes just under three seconds - not bad for a car weighing over twoand-a-half tonnes.

Of course, as a result of this performance the Panamera's economy isn't the best. CO,

emission stand at up to 245g/km, while combined it'll return 26.4mpg. Give the right pedal more work to do and it's highly likely that you'll be seeing figures in the high teens.

What's it like to drive?

First off - and there's no way to get away from it - the Panamera is a big car. You're quite aware of simply how far the car's edges are away from where you're sat, which can be a little intimidating to begin with. However, the more time you spend with the car, the smaller it becomes.

The steering is light enough around town to easily pilot it through smaller spaces, while the newly revised suspension does an excellent job of isolating the lumps and bumps on the road from the cabin. Rear-wheel steering means it's genuinely nimble at lower speeds, too. Then there's the performance. A

car of this size accelerating the way the Panamera Turbo S does is nothing short of startling; even moderate uses of throttle result in a considerable amount of forward progression. Full throttle results in you hitting the speed limit in the blink of an eye.

But the steering is the star of the show. It's effortlessly wellweighted, and it means you can enjoy the Panamera through the bends just as much as the earthshattering straight-line performance. You can add weight to the steering via the various driver modes, but in truth, it's just right in its standard setting.

How does it look?

The changes made to the exterior have certainly tweaked what was already a rather goodlooking sports saloon. It's sharper, for sure, but in truth we never had too many arguments with the way the Panamera met the eve.

We'd always plump for the Sport Turismo version (the estate), which, in our eyes, looks even better. The rear of the regular Panamera, which can from some angles appear a little dumpy, is replaced by a swooping back in the Sport Turismo, only enhancing the overall look of the car.

What's it like inside?

The cabin feels instantly luxurious. The materials are high-end and fitted seamlessly together, while the combination of glass, metal and leather is a tried-and-tested way of making a car's cockpit feel genuinely special. It certainly works here. It does feel like you sit a small amount higher than you'd expect, but with good levels of adjustability for the steering wheel it's not hard to find a comfortable driving position. The large screens ahead of you in the instrument binnacle are clear and easy to read, while the sport mode dial on the steering allows you to easily tailor the car's setup to your needs. It's a great combination of the old and new. There's a good amount of legroom in the back too, while 467 litres of boot space isn't too bad for a car in this segment. It can be increased by folding the rear seats down, pushing the size up to 1,306 litres.

What's the spec like?

The Panamera is laden with equipment. The main infotainment offering is centred around a large, clear screen in the middle of the dashboard which now includes wireless Apple CarPlay connectivity for the first time. Porsche's own software, however, is just as clear to use while haptic feedback buttons lower down towards the gearstick are responsive and easy to use.

All cars now ride on 21-inch wheels as standard too, while Porsche's range of suspension systems - including adaptive air suspension, rear-axle steering and the firm's power steering plus - all come as part of the Panamera's base price.

Verdict

The tweaks Porsche has made to the Panamera have only helped to elevate an already impressively capable saloon car. The steering adjustments have made it sharper, while the added performance on this Turbo S only makes driving it even more exciting. It looks a touch sharper,

Little has changed about its positioning in the segment, then. It easily manages to be the besthandling car among its peers and that's why, yet again, the Panamera is a car which we can wholeheartedly recommend. PA





Time to convert to Burmese food

Showcasing Burmese food might be a side-hustle for sisters, doctors and cooks Emily and Amy Chung - but it's proving a hit.

alt. sweet. sour. spice, umami and crunch - Burmese food has it all, and vet it's still relatively unknown in the West. However, it's hardly going to stay this way for long, particularly with the help of Emily and Amy Chung and their new cookbook, The Rangoon Sisters. The Chungs have Burmese parents and their nickname comes from the largest city in Myanmar -Yangon - which is also known as Rangoon. Most people still aren't really familiar with Burmese cuisine, which Amy drily describes as "absolutely delicious, obviously". So, what sums

"It does have influences from neighbouring countries, like Thailand, China and India, so there might be some familiar flavours and spices - and there's lots of onion, garlic and ginger," explains Amy. "But Burmese cuisine has a lot to offer as an individual cuisine as well; it has curries which tend to be more mildly spiced and aromatic after slow cooking, and you also have lots of vibrant fresh salads, which are more substantial than your average salad. It's full of textures and different condiments.' Emily says her favourite thing about Burmese food is "the extra bits you can add onto your plate, to make each mouthful a different flavour". She associates an "intensity and saltiness" with it because of the prevalence of "shrimpy, fishy flavours". This, coupled with all the dips and sauces that tend to feature, means "you can make your plate your own", she adds. "So if you'd like lots of chilli flavour, you can have that, and you can alter the sourness as well - there's

something for everybody."

(Serves 6) Stbsp oil (vegetable, sunflower or peanut), plus extra for browning the chicken 5 medium onions, chopped 10 garlic cloves, peeled 2 thumb-sized pieces of

ginger, peeled 8 skinless and boneless chicken thighs, chopped into 3cm pieces 2tbsp paprika 1tsp turmeric powder 2tsp chilli powder 100g creamed coconut (the solid block type), or 200ml coconut milk would work 2tbsp gram flour, sifted and evenly toasted in a dry frying pan 600ml chicken stock 2-3tbsp fish sauce 400ml cold water To serve: 6 nests (450-500g) dried chow mein or egg noodles, cooked 3 limes, cut into wedges 6 hard-boiled eggs, cut in Coriander leaves 4 shallots, thinly sliced 200g crispy fried rice noodles Chilli flakes or chilli oil Fish sauce

- 1. Heat the oil in a large casserole dish set over a medium heat. Add the chopped onions and cook slowly, turning down the heat to low-medium and stirring every four to five minutes until softened and starting to lightly brown in colour and become oily but not crispy - this should take about 15 minutes.
- 2. Meanwhile, crush the garlic cloves and ginger to a paste using a pestle and mortar, or blitz in a food processor.
- 3. Once the onions are ready, add the garlic and ginger paste and fry for two minutes to release the gorgeous flavours. Add a splash more oil, then brown the chicken pieces with the onion/garlic/ ginger mix. Add the spices and creamed coconut, breaking it up into smaller pieces as you stir - it should melt. Stir in the toasted gram flour, followed by the chicken stock, fish sauce and the cold water. Bring to the boil and allow to simmer, uncovered, over a low, gentle heat for about 30 minutes. If the broth is too thick, add some water. 4. For the crispy fried rice noodles, pour vegetable, sunflower or peanut oil into a wok or deep saucepan to a depth of 5cm and set over a medium-high heat. Line a large bowl with kitchen paper and have a heatproof strainer or sieve

ready for fishing out the noodles. Test the readiness of the oil by popping a piece of dried noodle into it - it should instantly sizzle (rice noodles will curl up and turn opaque and bubbly). Separate the nest of noodles and add a handful to the oil, frying for a minute, then scoop up with your chosen implement and drain on the kitchen paper. Continue to dry the remaining noodles in batches as above. 5. Serve the broth hot on a bed of cooked egg noodles. Add a squeeze of lime juice and top with boiled eggs and the remaining garnishes in little bowls for everyone to help themselves to.

Mango, lime and coconut meringues Ingredients: (Makes 8) For the meringues: 3 egg whites 170g caster sugar For the lime curd: Zest and juice of 2 limes 3 egg yolks 25g unsalted butter 50g caster sugar For assembly: 50g unsweetened desiccated coconut 300ml double cream 200g mango, stoned, peeled and diced into 1cm pieces.

1. Preheat the oven to 150°C/300°F/gas mark 2. 2. In a clean and dry mixing


bowl, whip the egg whites with an electric whisk. Start on a low speed and gradually increase the speed over the next two to three minutes to the highest setting until the egg whites are stiff peaks, then stop. Add half the sugar to the egg whites and whisk at high speed, then add the remaining sugar until the meringue is glossy and firm - this usually takes two minutes. 3. Line two baking sheets with greaseproof paper. Spoon four mounds of meringue onto each sheet, spaced out evenly. Using the back of a spoon, make a shallow dip in the centre of each meringue, where the topping will sit once they're cooked. Place the trays in the oven for 35 minutes; once that time is up, switch off the oven and leave the meringues to cool and dry in there overnight.

4. While the meringues are cooking, prepare the lime curd. Make a bainmarie with a heatproof bowl set over some simmering water (make sure the bowl does not touch the water, though) and add all the ingredients for the curd to the bowl. Stir to dissolve the sugar and melt the butter. Making the curd requires a bit of patience, as it will take anywhere between six and eight minutes to thicken: it should coat the back of a wooden spoon when it is

done. We then strain it through a sieve, to get rid of the zest, and let it cool before refrigerating overnight in a covered container.

5. For the assembly, toast the desiccated coconut in a dry frying pan on the hob, stirring throughout - watch it carefully and don't let it turn brown, it will only take a minute. Whip the double cream until it's thick. 6. Plate up the meringues, then top each one with a spoonful of cream, a dollop of lime curd, some mango pieces and finally a sprinkling of toasted coconut. Serve immediately.

Silk Floss Tree – What's the point?

This is the Silk Floss Tree. Sounds cuddly, right? But as you can see from the photos it's REALLY not. It's actually a tree hugger's worst nightmare.





ut it does have its good points. along with what you can clearly see are its bad points. Originally from South America, there are a few trees planted here and there across the Algarye. However, you don't usually notice them. They just sort of, provided you don't lean on them by mistake, fly under the radar and blend into the rest. That is of course, until now - when they steal the show. In the early autumn (around September/ October) like other deciduous trees, they do indeed start to slowly let their leaves 'fall' to the around. However, they also take this opportunity to simultaneously KA-BLOOM, and explode into beautiful star shaped, pink and white flowers. All the leaves eventually fall to the ground, and the whole thing is left looking bright pink. It's then that you simply can't miss them. (The one that first made itself abundantly clear to me can be found on the road out of Estoi towards Moncarapacho. If you feel like having a look.) The flowers then start to fall to the floor and the tree spends the winter completely bare (except for the fruit capsules - more on

them later) and sinks back

into obscurity once again. Although, you still might

notice some more unusual things if you pay closer

attention. Along with those

terrible spikes, another

strange thing about the Silk Floss is that the younger ones bottle neck shaped trunks and branches are green. This is due to a high chlorophyll content which allows them to do the quite unusual trick of performing photosynthesis - without any leaves. Although, when they get older they start to lose this ability, and like all of us, they start to turn grey. So, they are quite beautiful, but what's with those vicious spikes? They clearly don't want anybody to touch them. Why is that? Well, being native to tropical forests in South America the trees got fed up with monkeys climbing all over them. Good strategy I'd say. I mean, even us evolved monkeys only have to touch them once to learn our lesson. The thorns are also said to be a sort of drip irrigation system. Dew collects on the spikes and then condenses, and little droplets of water drip onto the ground near the tree. This can be a real lifesaver in times of drought, and helps to see them through the long hot summers. But why on earth would somebody call a tree this anti-social, and let's face it downright prickly, something as cute and cuddly as a Silk Floss? I did wonder. It's to do with the fruit it produces. It makes these quite large (inedible) avocado shaped capsules that contain lots of black seeds, but that's also surrounded by a fluffy matter, similar to cotton. that can be used to stuff

pillows. And also, due to its hydrophobic (that's a new one for me too. I had to look it up. It means ability to repel water, or more literally, fear of water) properties, it's also used in the material that goes into life preservers. In fact, the tree is pretty hydrophobic all round, and the water resistant bark was used by South Americans to build canoes (again, pretty ironic due to its phobia of water). Luckily though, not so much anymore, as there's not too many Silk Flosses around. and there's better material for canoe building these days, much to the tree's relief

If you are brave enough to plant one of these beautiful beasts in your garden, then, so there's no confusion in the garden centre, I should tell you that it can also be called the 'Kapok tree', and their botanical name is 'Ceiba speciosa'. They grow fast to start with and then slow down as they mature (don't we all?). They like well drained, moist and fertile soil, but be careful where you plant them as they can grow up to 15 metres tall. This means they can provide ample shade in the summer, but maybe keep

them at a distance - you

don't want to bump into

them too often

Utilise rubber gloves Rubber gloves don't just protect your hands while cleaning, they're great at getting rid of pet hairs too. All you do is pop on the gloves, wet them and wipe them over fabric. cleverly lifting the hairs. "Our best kept secret is to take a rubber glove and press on surfaces like sofas or any fabric, and that allows the hair to ball up," says Bally. "What's good about it is that it works for both cat and dog hair, short and long. Once it's balled up, you can just wipe the rest of the surface clean."

Cover up problem spots

If your dog or cat has a favourite spot they sit or lie on, cover it with a blanket that can be washed regularly.

Apply sticky tapeWind sticky tape round your hand, sticky side up, and brush it against furniture fabric or clothes pet hair will stick to it straightaway.

Try a damp cloth or fabric softener sheet A simple damp cloth will get rid of a lot of pet hairs microfibre cloths or sponges work particularly well. Similarly, a damp mop will pick up pet hairs on the floor. Another trick is using a slightly damp fabric softener sheet that you'd normally pop in your dryer - they're great for picking pet hairs up.

How can I help my young child to lose weight?

An early years expert explains that parents should instead focus on the amazing things healthy food and exercise can do for our bodies.

hild psychologist and early years teacher Hannah Tranah, childcare development manager at Storal Learning nurseries, says: "Talking to children about weight and size in the wrong way can be harmful, so it's important to go about this the right way - you want them to be healthy, but you also want them to be accepting of their bodies.

"For very young children, the best thing to do is avoid any discussion around weight, size or BMI - these metrics are not the best indicators of health. Instead, factors like nutrition and physical activity play a much more significant role. So the focus should be on the amazing things eating healthy foods and exercising can do for our bodies, like giving us the energy to run, jump and play. "You should also check in on how you and other adults your child spends time with interact and talk about body image and weight. Children copy our behaviour, so if they grow up

around adults who consistently criticise their own bodies or the bodies of others, they're likely to take on this negativity too. "While it's critical for children to gain an understanding of why a balanced diet and exercise is important, for very young children the most effective approach is 'less talking, more doing'. To make lasting change, lifestyle adjustments should be gentle and fun. Healthy eating should be a priority for the whole family, not just for your children. "Realise that as the parent, you have the most control over what the family consumes, so analyse your weekly shop and wherever you can, cut down on the junk and make healthy swaps in stages.

"Try not to worry, as children's tastes often change with age. Ensure your child is given the same food as the rest of the family and make sure you all eat together. Praise them when they try something new and be patient if they are slow. This 'gentle changes' approach also goes for physical exercise and

movement. Getting children into the habit of exercising when they're young and full of energy is much easier than when they're in their teens or in adulthood,

"Try out different forms of

movement and exercise as a family (even if it's walking to school instead of driving) and see if there are any physical activities your child might be interested in - whether this is taking up in a class or team

activity with their friends. This might take some trial and error, but pace it gradually - don't enrol your child in five different new hobbies at once, take your time with it and you'll be sure to find something they enjoy."

Could your child have undiagnosed ADHD?

hey're often misdiagnosed as 'naughty children' - and even if they're officially diagnosed with ADHD, many kids are still simply labelled as naughty. But attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD) is a recognised medical condition that affects around 3-5% of children and 2% of adults. One of the most common neurodevelopmental conditions in childhood, it is described by the NHS as: "A condition that affects people's behaviour. People with ADHD can seem restless, may have trouble concentrating and may act on impulse." Speaking to mark October's ADHD Awareness Month, Dr Tony Lloyd, chief executive of the ADHD Foundation, says: "There are several enduring myths about ADHD. Many parents will no doubt be concerned that a diagnosis of ADHD may be harmful in itself

because in the past it's been associated with 'naughty boys', or about giving children drugs to make them behave. "This is such a tragedy because although one in 20 children have ADHD, less than half of that number are ever assessed or diagnosed and as many as 50% of children who are referred for an assessment don't in fact have ADHD but instead have behaviours linked to trauma, anxiety or other neurological conditions. 'Sadly, many teachers, and some parents, think ADHD is about bad behaviour. ADHD is not a behavioural disorder - it's a neurodevelopmental condition characterised by a delay in development in certain parts of the

How is ADHD diagnosed?

The Royal College of Psychiatrists says there's no single, definite test for ADHD and diagnosis requires a specialist

assessment by a child psychiatrist or a paediatrician, who will observe the child and look for recognised patterns of behaviour, and get reports of their behaviour at home and school. Diagnosis doesn't usually happen until after the age of six.

What do parents need to look out for?

The ADHD Foundation says children with ADHD may exhibit certain characteristic behaviours and may be:

1. Anxious

Lloyd advises parents to speak with their child's school and ask if they

appear to be struggling with learning and displaying anxiety. "Anxiety is the main cause of distressed behaviours that aren't context appropriate for the classroom," he says.

2. Forgetful

A child with ADHD may often lose or forget things.

3. Unable to concentrate

They may find it difficult to sustain concentration or attention. "Let's be honest," says Lloyd, "all children find it difficult concentrating or staying on task. All children can be forgetful, impulsive and hyperactive. That's just how children are. What defines these characteristics as ADHD is that they present in a more extreme form.

4. Unable to organise their thoughts Children with ADHD often have what's known as poor executive functioning skills. Lloyd explains: "That's the ability to organise their thoughts and regulate their emotions to plan and organise how they do their school work, resulting in difficulty with starting tasks. So they procrastinate and become frustrated and overwhelmed as they can't order their thinking. On the plus side, this can

also be the engine of

creativity!" **5. Easily distracted**"They find it difficult to stay on task or become confused and frustrated by too much information or stimulation," explains Lloyd.

Hyperactive Some children with ADHD can be hyperactive. 'They're always on the go with seemingly boundless energy," says Lloyd, "and no matter how tired they are, they still have

difficulty sleeping." Impulsive Some children with ADHD can be impulsive. "They may say and do things they know aren't appropriate," says Lloyd, but their brain has failed to consider the consequences of their words or actions." He says such impulsiveness isn't the same as intentional

inappropriate behaviour.

8. Have relatives with learning difficulties Lloyd suggests parents ask if anyone in their extended family on both sides has either dyslexia, dyspraxia, autism spectrum or other learning impairments. "We know that while genetic in origin, ADHD comes under the umbrella of a number of learning difficulties which often co-exist." he explains, pointing out that more than 40% of children with ADHD also have

Pre-term births, epilepsy and brain injury can also be factors in determining whether a child has ADHD, and Lloyd adds: "ADHD is genetic in origin but how it affects the individual is determined by the environment - so how you parent your child, how your child's needs are addressed in school and things like nutrition, good sleep and even traumatic events in childhood can cause that genetic potential to be amplified. "Many people with ADHD lead happy, healthy, successful lives. Many achieve at school and there are many high profile role models who have ADHD - from Leonardo da Vinci, to astronaut Scott Kelly and Olympic gold-winning



Baby Steps to achieving a long healthy life Paula Martins



Health is the most important thing we have in our life; however, it is often only when we already have health problems that we remember to take care of our body.

aby Steps is a company that shows that small steps to change our habits can lead to unimaginable results, in terms of fertility but also in terms of general health. It is in Dublin, Ireland that we can find Lisa Morrissey, a 15 years acupuncture specialist and creator of the Baby Steps company, a company that helps lots of women to make their maternity dreams come true. Next year, it will be in Portugal that Baby Steps will continue to help hundreds of people with health problems and infertility.

Lisa Morrissey knows that trying to get pregnant after a few years of trying can be frustrating, but with the right help and enough discipline and motivation to change some everyday behaviours it is possible to achieve results in most cases

"The machine makes a sound that patients can listen to at home. After two or three days they feel the difference, the sound is only six minutes per day and helps to rebalance the waves", said the specialist. In addition to preventing serious illnesses, the health screening helps people with fertility problems. When a couple is trying for a baby, their bodies must be in optimal

health. According to Lisa Morrissey, "the major difference here is that we assess the complete body to homeostasis and don't just look at the reproductive organs" like conventional medicine. For many, alternatives medicines, among them being acupuncture. continue to not be welcomed by everyone, although the rate of successful fertility cases according to Lisa Morrissey is 90 percent. From Lisa Morrissey's experience, this is a concept that is

increasingly outdated. "People nowadays are aware of the alternatives and a lot of people -and social media talk a lot about the benefits of having good health - now understand the importance of prevention more and how you should not wait to have a problem before trying to fix it". Lisa Morrissey concludes that when the goal is the same - to support the body - all sciences are welcome. 

Check the health of your eyes

With so many frames and lenses out there to choose from we can sometimes forget the primary reason to visit your optician; to check the health of your eyes.

There are many diseases and associated conditions which can be picked up with an eye test, including glaucoma, cataracts and diabetes. The College of Optometrists in the UK recommends a yearly check for children under 16 and every two years for adults and at SN&N Optico the focus is always on encouraging regular eye exams for good health. A very common complaint here in the sunny Algarve is Allergic Conjunctivitis.

The two most common types of allergic conjunctivitis are seasonal allergic conjunctivitis (SAC) and perennial allergic conjunctivitis (PAC). Both are triggered by

an immune reaction when you come into contact with a particular substance you are allergic to, leading to symptoms such as itching and sneezing.

Eye allergies often affect the conjunctiva, a clear layer of skin overlying the eyes, which is the same type of skin that lines the inside of the nose, this is why the same allergens (e.g. pollen, grass, dust and pet dander) can trigger the same allergic response in both areas.

The main symptom of eye allergies is itchy eyes and may be associated with redness, watering, a burning sensation. and mucous production and blurring.

Diagnosis of eye allergies are usually made from symptoms and by examining the front of the eyes with a slit lamp (a special microscope) to check for dilated blood vessels, conjunctival swelling and eyelid swelling, all of which are indicative of an allergic reaction.

If you can identify and avoid the particular agent you are allergic to, symptoms will improve dramatically. Unfortunately, this is not always easy or possible! Avoid rubbing your eyes as this can worsen symptoms

A mantra for all golf



You'll hear many performance psychologists talking about the skill of being able to 'live in the moment' or 'get into the zone', where the player is able to exhibit 100 percent concentration without any concern for the future.

his is what has been called in the Far East the state of satori, where the individual feels everything but thinks nothing during performance such as martial arts.

The buzz words around performance psychology these days is all around making sure the process prior to performance and during performance is as close to perfect and well thought out as possible. All of this really means if you take care of what's in front of you and execute excellence every time, the outcome will be excellent too. Excellence in these terms is defined as doing the very best with what you have at the moment.

If you adhere to these simple terms and execute excellence every time, then the product of your efforts will be, by definition, the very best that you could do which in golf is the most sought after result there is.

There is a prayer which has been used or adopted by the organisation Alcoholics Anonymous which focuses on the day by day principle where if you take care of one day and all the

moments within it, that's all you can do, then after a period of time the days become weeks and the weeks become months and so on. The prayer goes, "God grant us the serenity to accept the things we cannot change, the courage to change the things we can, and the wisdom to know the difference." I appreciate this might be appearing a little deep and meaningful, with a touch of, "does Neil have a problem?" But I will stay in my lane, make this relevant as far as golf is concerned and leave the wider reaching topics to somebody far more qualified than myself.

Regarding the first sentence of the prayer where we're asked to except the things we cannot change, I see a huge relevance in golf when a player reacts badly to a golf shot. What's the point? You can't change what just happened, tying back to the original point if you executed excellence you wouldn't be upset, or if you did your best that's all you can do. Yet scanning across the golf course I can see on a minute by minute basis players being very upset with individual golf shots and then carrying the emotion along the fairway to the next shot which is

invariably another bad one. Yet if the player was able to accept that they did their best, with what they had at that moment, then they should be content. However, having a clear and accurate understanding about what they are capable of doing on a minute by minute or hour by hour basis is where sometimes the problem lies. The player could be accurately accused of trying to hit a golf shot beyond their capability, executing the shot knowing that they only had 0 percent chance of success and then getting upset that they didn't get their desired, unrealistic outcome.

If you were to look back to your last round of golf did you try and take on a shot which you are poorly prepared for, even when you were over the shot you had doubts and then when you hit the shot it didn't come off? Tie that back into the first sentence of the prayer - can you honestly say that you accepted the things that you cannot change, if you tried to take on the shot you tried to change your game into something it isn't. I find those three simple sentences really apply to a lot of areas. Next week we will touch on the second sentence which will

FC Porto received €35 million for the sale of footballers Alex Telles and Danilo in the final straight of the transfer market in Portugal, during which Benfica ceded Tiago Dantas and Sporting lost Wendel.



Brazilian defender Alex Telles went to Manchester United for an immediate €15 million

he Brazilian defender went to Manchester United for an immediate €15 million, to which €2 million can be added for the achievement of objectives, while the Portuguese midfielder went to Paris Saint-Germain, who will already pay €4 million for the loan for one year

and €16 million for the compulsory purchase clause at the end of the season. In the final days of the transfer window, the national champions also made the profitable sales of Tiquinho Soares (Tianjin Teda, €5.5 million), Zé Luís (Lokomotiv Moscovo, €5 million) and Yordan Osorio (Parma, €4 million) and

said goodbye to Vaná (Famalicão) and Vincent Aboubakar (Besiktas) without any fee and freed up Saidy Janko (Valladolid).

FC Porto also negotiated the transfers of Fernando Andrade (Rizespor) and Tomás Esteves (Reading), one of the European Under-19 champions in the main squad in 2019/20, with a view to future 'connections', as was the case with the transfers of Fábio Silva (€40 million) and Vítor Ferreira (€20 million purchase option loan) to Wolverhampton. Benfica, surprisingly, loaned the promising midfielder Tiago Dantas to the German and European champions Bayern Munich, fixing the purchase option at €8 million, in the same way as the transfer of the striker Carlos Vinícius, best scorer of the last edition of the I League, whose clause is around €45 million, of which three have already been paid by Tottenham. Other loans included defenders Pedro Álvaro (Belenenses SAD), Pedro Pereira (Crotone) and Tomás Tavares (Alavés), midfielders Alfa Semedo (Reading), David Tavares (Moreirense), Florentino (AS Mónaco), Krovinovic (West Brom) and Nuno Santos (Boavista) and forwards Cadiz (Nashville), Jota (Valladolid) and Yony González

(LA Galaxy). The Portuguese defender Rúben Dias led the definitive sales table of Benfica, signing for Manchester City in exchange for €68 million, well separated from his colleague Cristian Lema (Damac,€2 million) and goalkeeper Ivan Zlobin (€1 million), ready to review in Famalição the striker

Dyego Sousa, who stopped his transfer to Luz.

Alex Pinto (Farense), Bruno Varela (Vitória de Guimarães), Chris Willock (QPR), Heriberto Tavares (Brest), Ljubomir Fejsa (Al Ahli) and Andrija Zivkovic (PAOK), demanded €1.8 million to leave and contributed to keeping the Lisboners away from the €39.6 million associated with entering the group stage of the Champions League.

With almost half (€40.1 million) of the revenues added by rivals FC Porto (€73.75 million) and Benfica (€76.42 million), Sporting bid farewell to midfielder Wendel, who went to Zenit's Russians for €20.3 million, following in the footsteps of wing Marcos Acuña (Seville, €10.5 million) and Matheus Pereira (€9.1 million), bought out for good by West Bromwich. The defender Jérémy Mathieu finished his career in Alvalade, from where André Geraldes (APOEL), Rafael Barbosa (Tondela), Miguel Luís (Vitória de Guimarães), Francisco Geraldes and Gelson Dala (Rio Ave) left, at zero cost, in a window marked by several loans, with Rodrigo Battaglia (Alavés) at the head.

Valentin Rosier (Besiktas), Idrissa Doumbia (Huesca), Eduardo Henrique (Crotone), Mattheus Oliveira (Coritiba), Filipe Chaby (Académica), Abdoulay Diaby (Getafe), Pedro Mendes (Almería), Leonardo Ruiz (Logroñés) all had the same fate, although they did not represent significant 'casualties' in the rejuvenation of Sporting's

squad.

A similar reality was experienced by Sporting Braga, unchanging in the final hours of a closed season marked by the most valuable deal in its history - from Francisco Trincão, for FC Barcelona, for €31 million- as well as the definitive sale of Ahmed Hassan (Olympiacos, two ME) and the end of the transfers of Wallace (Lazio) and João Palhinha

(Sporting).

Pablo Santos (Hatayspor), Xadas (Mouscron) and Fábio Martins (Al Shabab) were on loan, as were the former athletes of Vitória de Guimarães Pedrão (Al Wahda) and Frederico Venâncio (Lugo), who attended the transfers of Pêpê (Olympiacos,€3 million), João Carlos Teixeira (Feyenoord, €1.6 million) and Davidson (Alanyaspor,€1 million). In the farewell to the 1st League are names like Miguel Silva (APOEL), Florent (Paris FC) and Ola John (RKC Waalwijk), transferred from Vimaranenses, Rúben Ribeiro (Hatayspor) and Hugo Vieira, from Gil Vicente, as well as Licá and Marco Matias, who have left the connection to Belenenses SAD, from where André Santos left to Grasshoppers. Pedrinho (Riga) left Paços de Ferreira, lago Santos (Al Taawon) and João Aurélio (Pafos) left Moreirense and Jackson Martínez finished his connection to Portimonense, while Boavista signalled the end of an era, saying goodbye to figures such as Idris (Sporting da Covilhã), Mateus (Penafiel) and Ricardo Costa (end of career).





Toni Martinez signs to FC Porto until 2025

Spanish striker Toni Martínez, who was playing for Famalicão, will strengthen FC Porto by signing a five-season contract, the national football champions announced.

The 23-year-old signed a contract valid until 30 June 2025 with the 'dragons', after having stood out in the service of Famalicão, where he was the second best scorer in the 2019/20 season, with 10 goals.

In his first statement as a player for the 'dragons', Toni Martínez said he was very pleased with the transfer.

"This is a unique feeling and a goal accomplished in my career: to join the best in Portugal, and I hope to return the trust placed in me on the

field," said the striker, in statements to FC PortoTV.

Martínez defined himself as a player who adapts to any scenario, without hiding the desire to score goals.

"I am a player who likes any kind of football. I'm a player who always adapts to everything. But mainly I'm a player who always thinks about the goal, about scoring goals and trying to help the team as much as possible. I'm a very committed player to the team and I'm very happy," he said.

The striker believes that he will still "grow and learn" a lot at FC Porto, a club that, according to the player, has one of the best teams in the world and that has the best players in the world".
